Lead Instructors

- Have either a degree in Theatre/related field and/or equivalent experience in working with young people
- Works with one age group throughout the summer with rotating groups with the assistance of a Co-Lead Instructor
- Will be the main contributor of script creation and director of their group's sharing
- Creates daily lesson plans to lead and fully engages their Co-Lead Instructor in the Preparation, Execution, and Follow-Up of these
- Provides opportunities for the Co-Lead to learn and grow as an Artist Educator
- Leads some camp-wide warm-ups and activities
- Creates and Maintains a Safe, Fun, & Creative Environment for all

Co-Lead Instructors:

- Working towards their degree in Theatre/related field and/or early career in teaching theatre and working with young people
- Paired with a Lead Instructor that will guide them in gaining practical experience in their desired areas of growth
- Works with one age group throughout the summer with rotating groups
- Assists the Lead Instructor in preparations and lesson plans
- Leads some daily activities with support from the Lead Instructor
- Supports the group with directing, stage management, and classroom management as needed
- Assists in Maintaining a Safe, Fun, & Creative Environment for all

Overall Details & Logistics:

- All positions are paid as Independent Contractors.
- All team members of Camp Shakespeare are responsible for their own housing.
- Camp Shakespeare runs Monday-Friday with working hours being approximately 8:15am-4:45pm.
- Camp will run mid-June mid-July.
- All team members will be required to attend a paid Orientation, Load In, and any performance nights that involve their campers (usually 2-3 Friday nights throughout the summer).
